College students performing research or creative projects pertaining to aging, under the mentorship of a faculty member, are encouraged to participate in the 2018 Gerontology Conference. The annual day-long conference, hosted by UVM's Center on Aging, will take place on March 26, 2018 at the Hilton Burlington. The theme for 2018 is "Caregiving for Persons Living with Dementia: Families and Professionals Working Together."

Research and creative projects at any stage of completion are welcome; projects must be presented in academic poster format.

Purpose: To showcase student research, increase student involvement in the field of gerontology, and to increase visibility for the Center on Aging among students, faculty and staff.

Poster Instructions

- Preferred Size: 24" x 36"; however, alternate sizes are acceptable
- Include sponsoring university logo (Exp. UVM tower logo)
- If your research is the result of program or external funding sources, include the appropriate logo and adhere to their specifications for size and format
- Save your final version in PDF format (this is generally necessary for printing)

Tips

- For best viewing and reading, make fonts size 40 or larger.
- Edit critically for spelling and for length.
- To insert graphs from Excel, use copy/paste. To insert images, use File Insert.
- Use high-quality images: when expanded to poster size they will lose some quality.
- People most often survey posters — interested people then read them. Have enough information for both kinds of viewers.
- When talking about your poster, have ready a 1-sentence introduction and a 2-5-minute description of your poster.
