NNE-CTR Call for Proposals

Northern New England
Clinical & Translational Research
Network

The newly formed Northern New England Clinical and Translational Research (NNE-CTR) Network has announced a call for pilot project proposals. One-year awards, up to \$50,000, will fall into two categories--for research and for translating and measuring findings in rural communities. The expectation of projects is that they have significant impact, through novel approaches, in improving health care for at-risk populations. Projects would include development of novel monitoring systems and/or interventions that could impact patient awareness or health needs. NNE-CTR is particularly interested in pilot studies in addiction medicine, cancer (lung, prostate, breast and others), and cardiovascular disease (including affected by obesity and diabetes). Research that addresses issues in rural communities is an important priority of the NET-CTR.

For 2017-2018 there will be two cycles of pilot awards. Cycle 1 letters of intent are due on **September 15, 2017** with full applications due October 25th. Cycle 2 letters of intent will be due April 4th with full applications due May 16, 2018.

Sally Herschorn, MD to Present Community Medical School Sept. 5th

On Tuesday, September 5, 2017, UVM Cancer Center member Sally Herschorn, MD, Associate Professor of Radiology and Medical Director and Division Chief, Breast Imaging, will present a Community Medical School lecture to the public titled, "Breast Density: The New Law & What It Means for Breast Cancer Screening & Risk."

As of January 15, 2017 all Vermont patients are legally required to be

informed of their breast density, but now that patients know their breast density, what should they do with this information? Learn how a woman's breast density category affects her risk of developing breast cancer and how radiologists can detect it on mammography. Find out what you can do to improve the odds of a cancer being detected early, when treatable. The pros and cons of additional screening methods will be discussed to help patients make better-informed choices.
