Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation for Childhood Cancer (ALSF) Familial RUNX1 Grant Program: Familial RUNX1 Research Grants of up to \$250,000 over two-years in support of research in strategies leading to the development of therapies to prevent the transition from pre-leukemia to leukemia for patients with FPD/AML. Projects should focus on leukemia caused by familial RUNX1 mutations rather than sporadic AML with somatic RUNX1 mutations. Letters of Intent are due June 1, 2017.

Limited Competition for Gabrielle's Angel Foundation (GAF) junior faculty grants supporting two-year research projects in hematologic malignancies at \$75,000 per year. The focus of this research grant is research with the potential to lead fewer people to start smoking, or to lead more people to cease smoking. Letters of Intent are due June 6, 2017.

National Cancer Institute (NCI) Cancer-Related Behavioral Research Through Integrating Existing Data R01 PAR-16-256 & R21 PAR-16-255 seek to integrate two or more independent data sets to answer novel cancer control and prevention questions. The goal is to encourage applications that incorporate Integrative Data Analysis (IDA) methods to study behavioral risk factors for cancer, including tobacco use, sedentary behavior, poor weight management, and lack of medical adherence to screening and vaccine uptake. Integrated data must be from different sources and types (including both quantitative and qualitative; data may

span different levels such as genetic and environmental) and should include at least one source of behavioral data. Importantly, applicants should use existing data sources rather than collect new data. **Application**Deadlines are June 7, 2017 for R01 and June 15, 2017 for R21, with subsequent deadlines through June 2019.

Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation for Childhood Cancer (ALSF) invites applications for the Psychosocial Grant Program, offering Psychosocial Launch Grants and Psychosocial Family Impact Grants of \$100,000 to \$300,000 over two to three years. Launch Grants are designed for early career researchers within 7 years of receiving their terminal degree/completing formal training who are working to explain and/or improve psychosocial outcomes of those affected by childhood cancer. National Cancer Institute Improving Smoking Cessation in Socioeconomically Disadvantaged Populations via Scalable Interventions R01 PAR-16-202 & R21 PAR-16-201 provide support for innovative and promising intervention research designed to improve smoking cessation outcomes among socioeconomically disadvantaged populations. Specifically, this FOA is intended to stimulate research efforts aimed at the development of smoking cessation interventions that: 1) are targeted to socioeconomically disadvantaged populations, and 2) could be made scalable for broad population impact. Applicants may propose projects that develop and test novel cessation interventions with the potential to be scaled up, as well as projects that focus on enhancing the effectiveness, quality, accessibility, utilization, and cost-effectiveness of currently scaled smoking cessation interventions. Early Phase Clinical Trials in Imaging and Image-Guided Interventions (R01); up to \$500,000 over three years for preliminary evaluation of the safety and efficacy of imaging agents, assessment of imaging systems, image processing, image-guided planning and/or execution therapy, contrast kinetic modeling, 3-D reconstruction and other quantitative tools. **Next deadline June 28**, **2017** with subsequent deadlines through January 2020.

Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation invites applications for the Damon Runyon-Rachleff Innovation Award, a two-year award funded at \$150,000 per year, with the opportunity for up to two additional years of funding (up to four years total for \$600,000). The Innovation Award provides funding to early career researchers who have an innovative new idea but lack sufficient preliminary data to obtain traditional funding. The proposed research must be novel, exceptionally creative and, if successful, have the strong potential for high impact in the cancer field. Application deadline is July 6, 2017.

National Cancer Institute Inter-organelle Communication in Cancer R01 PAR-17-203 & R21 PAR-17-204 for research projects that examine how inter-organelle communication in cancer cells and/or tumor-associated cells affects cellular function, adaptation, and phenotypic plasticity. **Deadline for Letters of Intent is July 16, 2017**, with additional deadlines though 2019.

Breast Cancer Alliance, Inc. invites clinical doctors and research scientists whose primary focus is breast cancer research and who are in the early stages of their career (no more than four years from completion of training), to apply for funding for the Young Investigator Grant, a two-year award for a total of \$125,000. Application deadline is July 21, 2017.

Meso Foundation sponsored Grants for Mesothelioma Research are two-year grants for up to \$50,000 per year for early detection and prevention of mesothelioma; Definition of targetable differences between normal and transformed mesothelium and development of novel strategies for treatment taking advantage of these targets; Determination of clinical/molecular determinants for prognosis; and Therapeutic intervention, including but not limited to immune response targeted therapy, novel chemotherapeutic compounds, and novel radiation or surgical techniques.
