

New Member Spotlight: Andrea Villanti, MPH, PhD



Andrea Villanti, MPH, PhD, associate professor of psychiatry, has joined the UVM Cancer Center as a full member in the Cancer Control and Population Health Science program. Her primary research focus is on young adult tobacco use, including looking at predictors and patterns of use and interventions to reduce tobacco use in young adults. She has expertise in translational research,

improving tobacco policy and program decision-making including tobacco regulator science. Dr. Villanti also serves as Project Director on the Vermont Center on Behavior and Health COBRE, leading a project to develop and test a novel smoking cessation intervention for socioeconomically-disadvantaged young adult smokers.
