In this position, I managed three active studies. One is a novel approach for cigarette smokers diagnosed with serious mental illness, another is a sponsored clinical trial for a medication used to treat cocaine use disorder, and the final one is an alcohol-fMRI study examining how sex and stressor-specific brain mechanisms relate to one's sensitivity to alcohol, other drugs of abuse, and to tolerance.

My responsibilities included:

- Manage participant recruitment and retention for three active studies.
- Conduct clinical screening for potential participants.
- Scheduling appointments while coordinating with study therapists and physicians.
- Lead participant appointments including consenting documents, vitals, and clinical assessments.
