



Sarah H. Heil, PhD, is a professor of psychiatry and psychological science at the University of Vermont (UVM) and a faculty member of the Vermont Center on Behavior and Health. Dr. Heil earned her PhD from Dartmouth College in 1997, then completed National Institutes of Health postdoctoral fellowships in substance abuse research at Wayne State University and the University of Vermont. She joined the faculty at UVM in 2002. Continuously funded by the National Institutes of Health since 2004, her research interests revolve around women with substance use disorders, frequently focusing on behavioral and pharmacological treatments for opioid and tobacco use disorder during pregnancy and on the sexual and reproductive health needs of this population. Dr. Heil has more than 125 publications to her credit and is an elected fellow of two divisions of the American Psychological Association. She has served as a standing member of a National Institutes of Health study section, on the board of directors of the College on Problems of Drug Dependence, and on the editorial boards of the journal *Psychology of Addictive Behaviors* and the journal *Experimental and Clinical Psychopharmacology*.
