Posting Title	Change to residency policy by Board of Trustees
Information	<p>(This announcement is expected to impact few out of state students)</p> <p>The Board of Trustees has recently approved an addendum to the Residency Policy for Larner College of Medicine students and medical school applicants.</p> <p>The change provides a 4 academic semester grace period for those who take temporary absence from the state of Vermont to gain medical experience prior to their medical education. This grace period applies to prospective and/or current students who qualified for Vermont residency, per UVM in-state status regulations, immediately prior to the temporary absence. Additional details are outlined in the linked addendum and residency regulations.</p> <p>The new policy is effective with upcoming spring 2021 bills. Any current out-of-state applicant student who wishes to have their residency (re)reviewed under this new policy must submit an Application for In-State Status and relevant documents by the deadline (two weeks after the start of the semester they are seeking in-state status).</p> <p>Please see the University residency website for further details on submitting the Application for In-State Status.</p> <p>Questions are best directed to RegRes@uvm.edu, however Medical Student Financial Services (medsfs@uvm.edu) is happy to be a liaison if needed.</p>
