Subject: Important Lottery Information - Please Read!!!

Hello Class of 2022!

Happy New Year!

Here are a few reminders about the Class of 2022 Advanced Integration Lottery that will open on Monday:

- To be **eligible to participate** in the lottery, students must have selected a specialty advisor in OASIS year 2021-2022.
- During the **first three stages of the lottery**, you will emerge with a maximum of one course placement per stage, limited to an internal medicine acting internship, a choice acting internship, and a required emergency medicine course.
 - **Connecticut campus students** are expected to select internal medicine acting internships and emergency medicine rotations in Connecticut, unless an exemption has been approved.
 - Vermont campus students are not restricted from selecting CT rotations, but housing may not be available/provided.
 - Students with approved fourth-year site exemptions are expected select and rank internal medicine and emergency medicine rotations during the first three stages of the lottery.
 - All students will emerge from the first three stages of the lottery with an internal medicine acting internship and an emergency medicine course. These courses will be randomly assigned during the third stage, if the lottery is unable to place you in a ranked selection.
 - Students are not required to schedule a choice acting internship through the lottery. However it is recommended as these enrollments tend to be competitive.
 - Students may not schedule more than one choice acting internship during the first three stages of the lottery. If placed in a second acting internship, it will be administratively dropped.
- During the **electives (fourth stage of the) lottery**:
 - You may choose whether to participate. Courses will not be administratively placed in your schedule.
 - You may “try for” as many or as few courses as you wish. You will end up with as many as the lottery algorithm is able to schedule.
 - The software will not schedule you for the same course more than once.
- **If you have not taken the USMLE Step 1 exam yet**, note that you may not engage in any 4th year clinical coursework until you have taken your Step 1 exam. Schedule your clinical courses with this mind, allowing yourself time to complete Step 1 before your first clinical course.
