Subject: Important Restrictions on Music that can be Played or Performed

TO: Deans, Vice Presidents, Directors, and Department Chairs

RE: Important Restrictions on Music that can be Played or Performed

This is an update and reminder that UVM does not have rights to publicly play the artists or musical works owned by the performance rights organization Global Music Rights (GMR), whether directly or through a service such as Spotify. If UVM violates this restriction, potentially significant monetary fines may be imposed.

As a result, music in GMR’s repertory may not be publicly played or performed by UVM.

Common examples of prohibited use included, but are not limited to:

- ? playing recorded music over a sound system at a University venue, function or athletic event;
- ? broadcasting music by the University’s radio station;
- ? playing recorded music at a fraternity, sorority or student club event;
- ? live performance of songs by a University a capella group; and
- ? making a promotional video that contains background music licensed by GMR.
