Dear Larner Community,

We are writing to share the news that Jill Jemison, M.B.A., Assistant Dean for Technology/Chief Information Officer for the Larner College of Medicine, will be leaving the College, as she has accepted a position at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, School of Medicine as Associate Dean, Information Technology, and Chief Information Officer.

We are grateful to Jill for her 20 years of service to the College and her outstanding leadership of our College of Medicine Technology Services unit. She has guided COMTS through significant growth and ensured that COMTS has continued to provide outstanding high-quality service, particularly through the pandemic. This high-caliber work has been reflected in our LCME accreditations and the national reputation Jill and her team have garnered over the years.

After joining the College in 2002 to lead our transition to online learning, Jill was named manager of online learning in 2004. Since 2010, she has led the College's Technology Services team, overseeing infrastructure, programming, education technology, audio-visual services and desktop computing and support. In 2014, she extended administrative and research support to the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. She was a faculty mentor for the Public Health Projects course for medical students and played leadership roles in three LCME accreditations. She was named Assistant Dean for Technology in 2020.

Jill's UVM service also includes work as a member of the Online Learning/Distance Education Advisory Board, the UVM Center for Computer Security and Privacy Advisory Board, and the IT governance committees. She is a founding member of the UVM Health Network Data Governance Council.

Nationally, Jill has served as chair of the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) Group on Information Resources (GIR) Steering Committee and was founding chair of the AAMC GIR Education Technology Working Group. In 2015-2016, she was the first female faculty director of the AAMC GIR Leadership Institute (now AAMC Leading Information Technology in Academic Medicine). She was an invited program member for the 2019 Annual Conference of Educause, a nonprofit organization dedicated to the advancement of higher education through the use of information technology. In 2020, she received the national GIR Service Award.

Regionally, Jill is a board member for the Northeast Research and Education Network and was a founding member of the Northeast Big Data Hub Seed Funding Committee.

Jill's last day will be September 9, 2022. Over the next few weeks, we will be securing interim leadership for COMTS and working on a plan for permanent leadership of COMTS.
