So, let me take this opportunity to state that it is our **VERY STRONG** recommendation that you go to the Davis Center for twice weekly testing for the time being. We have a superb record of keeping the M1 pod safe from COVID spreading in the classroom, and surveillance testing is a *crucial* piece of the puzzle. We can and will look at the data to see how testing is going and make changes in procedures if we need to.

Dear class of 2025 students,

I want to take a moment to share some updates about COVID-19 testing options and a return to in-person educational activities. To ensure that we have Day 0 and Day 5-7 day results before returning to in-person activities on campus, the University has opened up additional testing for LCOM medical students at the Davis Center testing site on **Sunday, January 9, 2022 from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** and approved LCOM resuming **in person curriculum activities Monday, January 10, 2022 at noon.** Please schedule a Day 5 test for Sunday using the CoVerified App. Your results should be available late Sunday night or early Monday morning. We also ask that you continue to test 2x/week throughout January to minimize infection and transmission on our LCOM campus.

Again, thank you for your flexibility and compliance with the requirements and expectations as we continue to navigate the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic and associated variants. We look forward to welcoming you back safely to campus.
