Visiting Diversity Clerkship in Internal Medicine

Scholarship Program

As a joint venture between the Office of Diversity & Community Engagement and the LSU Department of Internal Medicine, we are pleased to sponsor a fourth-year senior medical student who plans a career in Internal Medicine and wishes to experience a rotation in our University Medical Center-New Orleans. Students must self-identify as an under-represented minority (URM) and display genuine interest in exploring issues of social determinants of health, population medicine, access to care, and social justice.

The Internal Medicine Department at LSUHSC-New Orleans offers the enthusiastic student a challenging and rewarding clinical experience **in a supportive and clinically diverse environment. Students are valued members of our clinical services, and their education is a priority.** Our residents train in an environment that is collegial and prepares them to be successful in the community or academia. The Internal Medicine Department is staffed by faculty who are dedicated to excellence in teaching and patient care.

The LSU Health Sciences Center historically serves a large, metropolitan community with many under-resourced neighborhoods challenged by the social determinants of health and affected by health disparities. The historic mission of our training institution is to care for every member of our community, regardless of situation.

Students selected for the program will receive:

- \$1,500
- Housing provided by the LSU School of Medicine
- A resident or faculty mentor who will meet with the student during their rotation. Mentor will provide career/professional guidance and a personal connection to the community. will meet with the student during their rotation.
- Meeting with Internal Medicine Residency Program Director and/or Associate Program Director.
- Participation in all educational sessions with residents

Students will participate in a 4-week rotation to include time on our inpatient wards or subspecialty consultative services.

Requirements:

1. Students must be entering their **final** year of medical school at an accredited U.S. institution and must have completed all of their required core rotations (Medicine, Pediatrics, OB, Surgery, Psychiatry) prior to beginning the clerkship.
2. To apply, please complete and share:
 1. Application form (see page 3-4) with thorough answers to 3 questions pertaining to interests, personal strengths, and social determinants of health.
 2. Current CV.
 3. Submission of formal LSU Internal Medicine visiting clerkship application on VSAS, with all institutional requirements met. **Covid-19 vaccination is required for participation.**
3. **The number of students selected for visiting rotations in a clinical specialty will be strictly determined by each department (2 for Internal Medicine). Students selected for the visiting Internal Medicine clerkship will receive a guaranteed residency interview.**
