As we previously introduced, this cycle, the Otolaryngology community is introducing the [interview preference signaling program](#). The program is voluntary and designed to provide applicants with an equitable and credible approach to notify Programs of particular interest to facilitate the interview selection process. This program was developed by academic otolaryngology organizations and there is no cost for participation.

The GSA Committee on Student Affairs (COSA) met with the Otolaryngology Program Directors Organization (OPDO) team leading the preference signaling pilot for Otolaryngology. We had a rich discussion and they addressed many concerns raised by the committee; they also expressed a desire to continue discussions with COSA. We hope to learn more from this signaling pilot; and believe applicants, in consultation with their advisors, might benefit from sending signals to programs in which they are interested.
