

Hepatitis C and Pregnancy



Hepatitis C is a viral infection that can cause severe liver disease.

Infections are increasing in 20-39 year olds. During pregnancy or shortly after birth, a baby can be infected.

At least once during your pregnancy, a Hepatitis C screen is done.

IF your screen is positive, your infant is screened at 2-6 months.

IF your infant's screen is positive, their provider will discuss treatment.
