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Notes:

Primary Care Practice (AHEC defined): An office or clinic which offers general primary care to adults and/or children, an ongoing relationship between a primary care practitioner (PCP) and the patient, comprehensive care, continuity of care, and coordination of care in family medicine, general internal medicine, general obstetrics-gynecology, and general pediatric. Site may include patient's home for an "all home care" primary care practitioner.

Sites not included: walk-in/immediate/acute urgent care clinics, school-based clinics, free clinics, Planned Parenthood clinics, college health centers, Department of Corrections health facilities, sites for at-risk youth, sites for homeless people, nursing homes, residential assisted-living facilities, and Veterans Administration clinics.

Primary Care Practitioners (AHEC defined): PCPs include physicians (MDs and DOs), advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs), certified nurse midwives (CNMs), and certified physician assistants (PA-Cs) at primary care practice sites (AHEC defined). Naturopathic physicians (NDs) not included.
