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SAFETY & SECURITY

The University uses a holistic and community-centric model to promote the safety and security of everyone on campus. As UVM community members, the goal of University Police Services is to be available should you ever need help or support. If you are experiencing an emergency, please call 911 or contact UVM Police Services at 802-656-3473. You can also communicate with UVM Police by using the [LiveSafe](#) application, activating the Blue Light system, or by flagging down or approaching an officer around campus. UVM Officers are specifically trained in community policing, are available 24/7 every day, and can help you get connected with medical, mental health, or other UVM support resources in emergency and non-emergency situations. All of the residence halls are locked 24/7 (with the exception of the Living/Learning complex which contains administrative offices during the workday), and all academic buildings are locked overnight. Key locations on campus are equipped with security cameras and alarms to ensure that our community is safe and secure.
