Dear Students, Faculty, and Staff,

In the last week, Enterprise Technology Services has been combating a concerted campaign to steal UVM NetID login credentials and money through fraudulent emails with subjects like “New File shared with you.” and “OVERDUE UVM PAYMENT !!!”. **Some may have resulted in fraudulent payments via Stripe**; please check your credit and debit card accounts for unexpected Stripe charges. You may be able to determine details for Stripe transactions via their [Charge Lookup](#) tool.

In general, remain cautious of attachments and links that come from a stranger (even someone within UVM) or that you were not otherwise expecting. When in doubt, verify legitimacy by contacting the sender via some other channel (phone or Teams) or contact iso@uvm.edu for help.
