Partnering with Providence Regional Medical Center Everett, our program emphasizes academic excellence throughout the training experience, offering a learning environment that balances the personal and professional needs of our house staff.

The program's mission is to train compassionate, dedicated, and well-rounded general internists suited to care for rural and underserved communities throughout the state of Washington. This mission includes a strong commitment to resident education, excellence in clinical care, and research. We are looking for compassionate, highly motivated candidates that would like to shape our program and the future of primary care.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Internal Medicine Residency program offers a categorical three-year resident training program with a special focus on primary care. Residents are integrated into an evolving value-

based care model, focusing on care coordination, patient outcomes, caregiver satisfaction, and optimized health care.

With our program size, residents will frequently interact directly with faculty as well as have the opportunity to work with patient-centered care teams. Residents train in diverse populations as well as in longitudinal continuity clinics, producing graduates who have a wide array of experience from primary and multispecialty care.

CURRICULUM COMPONENTS

Residents divide their time between general medicine and subspecialty ward services, intensive care units, ambulatory care experiences, consultation rotations, emergency rooms and long-term care settings.

ABOUT THE APPLICATION PROCESS

We accept application through the Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS). Any information submitted outside of ERAS cannot be accepted. International graduates are encouraged to apply; however, we only accept the J-1 visa at this time.

In addition to the other documents required by ERAS, (Med. School transcript, MSPE, etc), the following documents are required to apply to our program:

- Current USMLE/COMLEX Transcripts/Board Part 1 and 2 (if available) Scores
- CV
- Personal Statement
- 3 Letters of recommendation, one must be from medicine department chair, clinical supervisor, clerkship director or IM PD

TRAINING FACILITIES

The program offers broad clinical experience over a range of clinical settings. Residents will have the opportunity to provide supervised patient care at Providence Regional Medical Center Everett, a 580-bed, level 2 trauma center, and at various clinical training sites. These include The Everett Clinic, Snohomish Kidney Institute, Western Washington Medical Group, and Providence Medical Group.
